Three countries, four local partners, five weeks.

Four primary schools, six neighbourhood care points, one community project to support vulnerable children, seven visits to the homes of the elderly, one special school for physically handicapped children and one conservation project. Ten flights, ranging from international flights to a flight over the Masai Mara in the co-pilot's seat of a tiny, 12-seater plane.

Learning to say 'Good morning', 'How are you?' and 'Thank you' in four African languages – Xhosa, siSwati, Zulu and Swahili, with possibly a bit of Soweto street-slang thrown in as well. And most importantly meeting many, many new people, all working hard in difficult circumstances to improve the lives of others in their community.
