Diana, who loves walking and painting, lives near Chippenham and is a retired teacher and youth worker. Both share a love of travel.

These two women, with different skills, each worked with volunteer organisation people and places to find the right volunteer experience. "We pride ourselves on putting the right people in the right

places, at the right time!" says Kate Stefanko, Placements Director at people and places.

Ursula travelled to Kathmandu in Nepal, where she stayed in a comfortable hotel and worked for four weeks in an orphanage, sharing her child-care skills and supporting the work of the local staff.

"This has been a very rewarding and thought-provoking experience, which I will remember with great fondness," says Ursula. "I have been reminded of how much we take for granted and how much we could learn from other cultures where people have so little. The children are so happy with so few material possessions that it makes me question whether we need quite so many to achieve contentment. My grateful thanks go to all who made this adventure possible."

Diana spent four weeks living with a local family and working in a rural

school in Nomathamsanqa, on the boundary of Addo Elephant Park in South Africa's Eastern Cape.

"It was an amazing experience to live in the township and see the strong community spirit and to get to know such amazing and well-respected people as my host family," says Diana. "I loved the idea that all the doors and windows were left open as opposed to the electric fencing and gates in nearby towns! The school is amazing! The children are so warm, friendly and well-behaved, and the staff made me feel so welcome."

These different journeys in very different corners of the world brought these two Wiltshire women together in November, when Ursula and Diana attended a social in Chippenham, organised by people and places.

"Our socials provide opportunities for volunteers to share their experiences," says Kate. "We'd love to meet more local people who may be thinking about volunteering overseas. Talking with our volunteers is a great way for them to learn about the joys and challenges of volunteering – whether with us or any other organisation!"
